Background to Canada's Sports Hall of Fame.

Canada's Sports Hall of Fame, an international award-winning facility and host of the 2016 International Sport Heritage Association Annual Conference, is situated in the heart of the Canadian West in Calgary, Alberta. Just a one hour drive from Banff National Park and the world renowned Canadian Rocky Mountains. Calgary offers a unique blend of rustic pioneer charm with modern innovation and entertainment for the whole family. The city is a vibrant hub of year-round arts, culture, dining, shopping, festivals and events.

Canada's Sports Hall of Fame, established in 1955, moved from Toronto to Calgary and re-opened its doors in July 2011. It is a must-see state of the art facility with over 40,000 square feet of interactive experiences and a collection of more than 95,000 artefacts. With 52 hands-on interactive exhibits including shadow boxing, wheelchair racing, 3D hockey and multisport simulators, Canada's Sports Hall of Fame is fun, educational and inspiring for people of all ages.

Play Hard, Fight Hard: Sports and the Canadian Military Travelling Exhibit

The Army Museum of Alberta and Canada's Sports Hall of Fame are developing a travelling exhibit. The intent is to share over twenty stories of Alberta and Canada's significant military athletes including Alex Decoteau, Percy Molson, Tom Longboat, Winnie Roach, and Conn Smythe, showcase sport collections related to 10-15 major sports that military athletes competed in including a RCAF Flyers jersey, Seaman's Air Force uniform, track and field medallions, showcase sports unique to the military like broom-i-loo, and incorporate audio visual materials to help tell the stories of the athletes and their sports. The themes will relate to sport involvement during WWI and WWII, however, sport involvement spans a much greater time period (1880's to the present). Content related to pre and post World Wars will be used to show the immense impact the military has had in shaping the world of sport in Canada and vice versa.

- 75 artefacts to be displayed in museum display cases provided by host museum (cases not provided as part of the travelling exhibit)

- Each museum that borrows the exhibit will be encouraged to create at least one display case of artefacts/photographs that relates to one of their military/sport heroes.



Nova Scotia Sport Hall of Fame Hosts 2015 CASH Conference

The Nova Scotia Sport Hall of Fame hosted the 2015 Canadian Association for Sport Heritage (CASH) national conference in Halifax, June 10-12, 2015.

The conference, which takes place every two years, was co-hosted by Canada's Sports Hall of Fame and the Alberta Sports Hall of Fame in 2013.

The 2015 conference welcomed representatives from sport heritage organizations, sport governing bodies and other heritage organizations from across the country, including delegates from Canada's Sports Hall of Fame, the Alberta Sports Hall of Fame, British Columbia Sports Hall of Fame, Skate Canada, Library and Archives Canada, and many more.

There was also a strong representation from the Maritime Provinces, with delegates from many local

organizations such as the Colchester County Sport Hall of Fame, the Pictou County Sport Heritage Hall of Fame and the Maritime Motorsports Hall of Fame.

The conference kicked off on Wednesday, June 10, with an education presentation, special visit and reception at the Nova Scotia Sport Hall of Fame in the Scotiabank Centre. Two days of sessions followed on June 11 and 12 at the Westin Nova Scotian. Sessions covered topics such as strategic board recruitment, the induction process, and new technology. A variety of speakers presented the sessions, including special guests from the Association of Nova Scotia Museums, Scotiabank Blue Nose Marathon, and the Heart & Stroke 60 Minute Kids Club.

The CASH annual general meeting took place during the conference on Thursday, June 11.

Three major exhibits were launched in November 2015, all of which were dedicated to sports and the journey athletes must take to succeed.

The Feature Exhibit is titled *Defining Moments: The Injuries that Do Not Define Us*. This exhibit explores the journey of six athletes from their early careers through serious injuries and their experiences in overcoming the injuries to continue in sport. These six athletes chose to rise above their injuries by embracing challenges and hard work. In doing so, they discovered their defining moment.

The Art Gallery also launched in November 2015, with photographer Dave Holland's *The Moments That Make Us*. As the official photographer of the Canadian Sport Institute Calgary, Dave has the privilege of capturing Canada's best Olympic and Paralympic athletes and hopefuls. He worked with them while they trained and tested, and fol-

lowed them to their competitions including world cups, world championships and Commonwealth, Olympic and Paralympic Games!

Lastly, the 2019 Canada Winter Games Big Chuckwagon was returned to Red Deer and is currently on display in our Lobby. The Red Deer 2019 Canada Winter Games Committee set itself apart from other big communities in Alberta by sending its bid proposals to the Bid Committee via a mini-chuckwagon. This beautiful piece of art represents Alberta Heritage and has carvings as all of Canada Winter Games we hope to have in attendance at the 2019 Games.

2016 marks the 50th Anniversary of the BC Sports Hall of Fame, and we have many celebrations planned, including new exhibits, increased outreach initiatives, and on June 9th, we honoured our 50th Class of Inductees, as well as revealing the results of our 50 Golden Moments project.

Hockey Hall of Fame Announces 2016 Inductees

Lanny McDonald, Chairman of the Hockey Hall of Fame and John Davidson, Chairman of the Selection Committee, announced today that four individuals have been elected to Hockey Hall of Fame Honoured Membership: three in the Player Category and one in the Builder Category. The vote took place on June 27th, 2016 at the annual meeting of the Selection Committee in Toronto.

"The Hockey Hall of Fame is proud to welcome these four hockey legends as Honoured Members," said John Davidson. "Their contributions to the game of hockey are well documented and their election to the Hockey Hall of Fame is richly deserved."



In the Builder Category, **Pat Quinn** was elected. After nine seasons in the NHL, Pat joined the Philadelphia Flyers as an assistant coach in 1977. Over the next almost 40 years, he held coaching, managing and President positions, both in the NHL and with Team Canada.

At the time of his death in November, 2014, he was Chair of the Hockey Hall of Fame.

"Being recognized by Pat's hockey peers is truly a great honour," said his wife, Sandra Quinn. "I'm proud of Pat and what he accomplished."

Eric Lindros exemplified the power forward position throughout his 14 year NHL career. He won gold for Canada both at the Olympic Games and the Canada Cup and also averaged over a point a game in the NHL.



"I was very fortunate to have coaches, teammates, billets and parents who supported me throughout my career," said Lindros. "It also takes a lot of luck to get to the NHL."

Sergei Makarov led the Soviet League in scoring for nine seasons, while also winning eight World Champi-

onship gold medals and two Olympic gold medals. He later joined the NHL as a member of the Calgary Flames in 1989 and went on to play in over 400 NHL games.

"For everyone who plays the game, this is the top place," said Markarov. "It will be so nice to join all of those great players."



Rogie Vachon joined the Montreal Canadiens in 1966 and won three Stanley Cups in his first six NHL seasons. After being traded to the LA Kings in 1971, he continued his stellar career for 11 more seasons before retiring to become an NHL coach and executive.

"I was very lucky to play for the Montreal Canadiens at the start of my career," said Vachon. "My first shot on net was a breakaway by Gordie Howe. I stopped it and it kept me in the league for 16 more years."

The 2016 Induction Celebration will be held on Monday, November 14th at the Hockey Hall of Fame in Toronto. For more information regarding the 2016 Induction Weekend/Celebration, visit <http://www.hhof.com>.

Night of Champions

The Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame celebrated the induction of 2 individuals and one team on Saturday, April 30 2016 at Sport Manitoba's Night of Champions presented by Manitoba Chicken Producers.

The late **Herb Gardiner** was represented by his grandson Jim Rhodes who came in from Philadelphia, PA to accept this long overdue honour. Gardiner won the Hart Trophy as the NHL's MVP in 1927.

Gary Aldcorn was a truly all round athlete having played pro in the NHL with both Toronto and Detroit, as well as for the Canadian national team at the World Champion-

ships as an amateur. An excellent lacrosse player, Aldcorn played in the finals of the Minto Cup, the Junior A championship of Canada as well as a high level of baseball and curling. Aldcorn came in from sailing off the coast of Guadalupe for the event.

The **1962 Army Navy Air Force (ANAF) Scottish** soccer team won the national title over 54 years ago and they finally got their due at the Night of Champions.
