CASH AWARD OF EXCELLENCE

The Canadian Association for Sport Heritage has established an Award of Excellence to recognize and celebrate the achievements of our members.

What projects are eligible?

There are four broad categories for the CASH Award of Excellence: Museum, Events, Communication and Collection.

Any organizational member of CASH can submit <u>one</u> entry in each of the four categories. For the inaugural year in 2021 one overall award across all four categories will be given out with the possibility of expanding the number of awards in future years. Eligible projects must have been completed between January 1, 2019 and December 31, 2020. **The submission deadline is May 1, 2021.**

CASH AWARD OF EXCELLENCE CONT'D

How often will the Award of Excellence be given out?

The Award of Excellence will be recognized annually at the AGM or conference.

What do the winners receive/why should I apply?

Winners will receive an award to display at their Hall as a tangible representation of your achievement. Winners will be highlighted in the CASH newsletter, website, and social media. Winning an award is a great reason to contact your local media outlets and share your successes with your community. They can be useful for future grant applications to demonstrate your track record of excellent work as well as raise awareness about your Hall of Fame.

Who decides which project will receive an award?

Submissions for the CASH Award of Excellence will be evaluated by the Awards Committee using a point system. The Committee will be formed of interested CASH members and led by a member of the CASH Board of Directors.

How do I submit a project for consideration?

To submit your project for consideration, please fill out an application form and submit supplementary materials (ex. photos, videos, a virtual tour of an exhibit, sample documents, projects plans or any other materials you feel showcase your project.) via email to cansportheritage@gmail.com. The Awards Committee prefers that all applications and supporting materials be received in one PDF document, if possible.

SASKATCHEWAN SPORTS HALL OF FAME



The Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame (SSHF) rang in the New Year by unveiling our newest virtual tour. Prairie Pride: A History of Saskatchewan Football

debuted in September and now our newest featured exhibit is also available online.

The exhibit is supplemented with additional videos, stories, and links for the immersive virtual tour. This is the second virtual tour that the SSHF has created with the expertise of local partners White Rabbit VR. With a recent spike in COVID-19 cases in the province, the SSHF decided to close to

the public indefinitely. This virtual tour allows us to share our new exhibit virtually and will endure after the exhibit closes.

Upon re-opening our doors in the fall, not only did the SSHF have a new exhibit on

display, but our renovations had also been

completed. Along with new carpeting and a fresh coat of paint, our third gallery is now our Hall of Fame Inductee Gallery and features depictions of each of our 527 inducted athletes, builders, and

teams grouped by year of induction.
Our new STEM Interactive Gallery sponsored by SaskTel brings the relationship between STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) and sport to



life through interactive displays.

While the pandemic has not allowed for typical programming, our Education Coordinator Vickie Krauss has begun hosting "virtual field trips" where she tours a classroom through the Hall of Fame. This has allowed Vickie to do tours with multiple classes at the same time and supports the educational programming and curriculum that is on our web site. Experiments related to our new STEM Gallery have also been added to the education page on our web site.

The SSHF also debuted our first virtual Women in Sport panel discussion video of the year featuring SSHF inductee and Canadian Olympian Catriona Le May Doan.

BC SPORTS HALL OF FAME

BC Sports Hall of Fame and Dragon Boat BC Partner on New Special Exhibition 'Paddles Up!'

As it was for most, 2020 was a difficult year for the BC Sports Hall of Fame, but one of the highlights arrived unexpectedly in the fall. If you had suggested early in the Covid-19

pandemic that a new exhibition would be developed this year, we'd have thought you were crazy. But that's exactly what was pulled off.

For several months
Dragon Boat BC had
been working on an
exhibition on dragon
boat racing, but
needed a location. We
first met in October
and soon had a plan
for installation of the



exhibition in the BC Sports Hall of Fame's Special Exhibition space to be completed by early December. It was an aggressive timeline, but Dragon Boat BC and BC Sports Hall of Fame staff worked in tandem following health and safety protocols to open to the public Paddles Up: The Canadian International Dragon Boat Festival Exhibit.

Paddles Up traces the rich history of dragon boat racing in Chinese culture and also in Vancouver, dating back to Expo '86 when the first Dragon Boat festival outside of China took place in Vancouver's False Creek waterfront area. The exhibit allows visitors to get a close look at two full-size 40-foot dragon boats, as well as four different dragon heads that have adorned dragon boats at various times over the past 35 years. Visitors can also see posters, medals, trophies, and other souvenirs from the past three decades of racing. Videos feature participants of all ages and backgrounds discussing their involvement in dragon boat racing and what the sport means to them. The exhibition is scheduled to run until fall 2021.

MANITOBA SPORTS HALL OF FAME

We have taken the opportunity to refresh all of our Decade Galleries during the COVID closure. Curator Andrea Reichert and her student Angela May are working with Gallery Coordinator Rich Harzing to expand and refresh our Decade Galleries in the Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame. When we opened at this location in 2011, we had the outer walls dedicated to decades from the late 1800s, through the 20s, 30s, 40s, etc. all the way up to a final Gallery dedicated to 2000+ that didn't necessarily feature Honoured Members.



Since that time we are now two decades into the 2000s and many of those featured have since been inducted. So the new refresh gives us an opportunity to include these athletes,

builders and teams and to revisit the previous Decade Galleries with a focus on diversity whenever possible. So the BIPOC, Paralympic and LGBTQ communities are more prevalent and celebrated. We have also taken the time to create another 60 images for the hallways of Sport Manitoba's 6 floors (see photos) to go with the original 60 installed 8 years ago. Again more diversity in our focus and recent inducted members were selected. These 30" x 40" black and white photos are both interesting and act as way finders in our building (first left after Clara Hughes

PETERBOROUGH & DISTRICT SPORTS HALL OF FAME

The Peterborough & **District Sports Hall** of Fame has been closed to the public since March 12, 2020 due to COVID 19. All planned activities for 2020 were cancelled. in particular, the Induction Dinner, our annual Golf Tournament and 2021 Car Draw (two major fundraisers). We have not formally recognized our 2020 inductees and 2021 induction is on hold. Local media have been very supportive as we engage with

them to profile the Hall of Fame. Cogeco YOURTV has been producing a series of interviews with Hall of Fame Inductees called "Sports Legends of Peterborough". These have been broadcasted on Cogeco TV, Cogeco YouTube channel and available on the Peterborough & District Sports Hall of Fame website and Facebook. We increased the number of Bursary Awards presented to local graduating high school students from 4 to 6, recognizing the hardship created by the pandemic. Each student received an award of \$2,000. We produced and posted a Remembrance Video to pay tribute to our veterans. In July, the City of Peterborough allowed our volunteers to access the Hall of Fame. We were able to implement a number of upgrades to the Hall during this time. We installed four new custom built display cases. We lost a number of iconic sports figures this year, one being Lefty Reid, who was the Curator of the Hockey Hall of Fame and Canada Sports Hall of Fame when these facilities were at the CNE site. Lefty played a major role in the development of the PDSHOF. As of mid December 2020, the Hall of Fame has again been closed. We do not know what 2021 holds for us, but we do know we need to expand our use of social media and we need to explore our options for virtual presentation.

The Alberta Sports Hall of Fame is excited to announce an enhanced experience welcoming our visitors back to the Hall of Fame when we reopen.

Thanks to the success of our recent fundraising efforts, we were able to purchase new interactive experiences to thrill visitors of all ages. We recently installed these systems, which include a Hoops FX arcade basketball game, a Super Chexx Bubble Hockey Game, and an Obie Projector System in our facility.



Standing at over eight feet tall, Hoops FX will challenge our visitors' shooting skills as they try to score as many points as possible before the time runs out. Did we

mention that there is an extra challenge?

The basket and rim move throughout the game.

Super Chexx is the top tier of bubble

hockey games, featuring a 5"
LCD jumbotron, animated videos, live action game calls, and LED lighting. We're excited to announce that the bubble hockey game is located within the Alberta



Hockey Hall of Fame, which we host in partnership with Hockey Alberta.

Obie is an interactive playground projector geared towards our younger visitors. With no screens to touch, or items to throw, Obie is a very hygienic system – a huge plus in today's climate. To celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Canadian Golf Hall of Fame in 2021, we will

be featuring the top 50 moments in Canadian golf history. The general public will vote on their favourite 10 moments to create a top 10 moments list that will be unveiled during our gala.

CANADA SOCCER HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2020 GUIDE



A gala to celebrate the 50th anniversary will also take place during Hall of Fame Day, Tuesday, June 8, 2021 (whether virtually or in-person).
