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CASH TREASURER & NORTHWESTERN ONTARIO SPORTS HALL OF FAME EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR DIANE IMRIE

Throughout her 35 years as the Executive Director of the Northwestern Ontario Sports Hall of Fame in Thunder Bay, Ontario, Diane Imrie has served as a volunteer with organizations dedicated to the preservation of heritage from the local to the international level. Her longest consecutive years of service have been with the Canadian Association for Sport Heritage which dates back to 1988 when she first joined the board. During her over three decades on the CASH board she has undertaken a number of positions including a term as President from 1993-95, V-P Communications, Secretary and has served as Treasurer since 2008. A member of the Board of the International Association of Sports Museums and Halls of Fame from 1993-2000, (known today as the International Sports

Heritage Association), in 1997 she was

elected the organization's first female President. A founding member of Skate Canada's Hall of Fame Board in 1990, she continues to volunteer for Skate Canada's Hall of Fame and Heritage Committee and most recently completed over twenty years of volunteerism with Golf Canada and their various heritage committees. Her contributions to other organizations have included volunteering on boards and committees with the Ontario and Northwestern Ontario Archives Associations, Ontario Museum Association and the Thunder Bay Arts & Heritage Alliance. Active with a number of event hosting groups since the early 1990s, her most recent involvement has included the 2020 Special Olympics Canada Winter Games (Co-Manager of Figure Skating) and serving as a Vice-Chair with Thunder Bay's host committee for the 2022 Scotties Tournament of Hearts.



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PRINCE ALBERT SPORTS HALL OF FAME PRESIDENT ELLEN GREWCOCK



Ellen Grewcock has been on the Board of Directors of the Prince Albert Sports Hall of Fame since 2003 and President of the organization since 2007. She was inducted into the hall in 2010 as both an athlete and builder for her exemplary career in softball, curling, basketball, tennis and badminton, then her storied involvement in sport following her playing days.

Besides being a stand out athlete, Ellen went on to coach, officiate and provide administrative support to many of the sports that she previously participated in, getting to know many athletes and coaches across many disciplines of sport. Ellen attends almost every sporting event in the city and is a

passionate fan of especially school sports at all levels right up to USport.

Ellen is the prefect President for the Prince Albert Sports Hall of Fame as she has vast knowledge of anything related to sports in Prince Albert and area. The retired educator is a tireless volunteer for the Hall arranging meetings and banquets, soliciting community members to nominate inductees, sharing her experiences and providing guidance to the board.



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CAMBRIDGE SPORTS HALL OF FAME VOLUNTEERS AL AND LINDA ROBERTSON



The Cambridge Sports Hall of Fame would like to recognize AI and Linda Robertson who, for 20 years, have looked after the display cases that honour our inductees. 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BC SPORTS HALL OF FAME VOLUNTEER JACK FARLEY



Jack Farley (1933-2021): In Memoriam

Over its 55-year history few individuals have played a more critical volunteer role in elevating the BC Sports Hall of Fame than Jack Farley. As a BC Sports Hall of Fame trustee from 1982-2006, he served the longest uninterrupted term of any trustee in the organization's history. During that term he also served as the BC Sports Hall of Fame's Chair from 1992-93.

Jack helped with the effort to relocate the BC Sports Hall of Fame from its original location at the PNE to its current home at BC Place Stadium. Jack volunteered countless hours leading a fundraising campaign that raised over \$5 million to relocate, design, and build one of the most interactive sports museums in North America at the time of the

project's completion in 1995.

When rising project costs put the new hall of fame's completion in doubt, Jack held a closed door meeting calling on a select group of colleagues to join him as part of the 'Finish Line Team', each person donating \$100,000 to raise the final \$1 million needed. Jack wrote the first \$100,000 cheque himself on the spot. By meeting's end, the \$1 million was raised and the new BC Sports Hall of Fame was later opened. That perhaps more than any other anecdote illustrates the high esteem Jack was held and what he would do for this organization. He will be greatly missed by the BC Sports Hall of Fame family and the larger BC sport community.



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
NOVA SCOTIA SPORT HALL OF FAME VOLUNTEER DAVE THOMSON


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MANITOBA SPORTS HALL OF FAME VOLUNTEER BLAKE FITZPATRICK

The Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame has only had three volunteer Selection Committee Chairs in its 41+ years of operation: Terry Hind throughout the 80s and 90s, Dennis Nord in the 90s and well into the 2000s and Blake Fitzpatrick for much of the past decade and a half. The Secretary-treasurer of Maple Leaf Construction here in Winnipeg has also been involved in the MJHL for many years with the Saints hockey club. He has served on the Board of Directors of the Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame for over 20 years with a short respite in between to come back and serve as Selection Committee Chair. His easy-going demeanor and impeccable integrity made him perfect for the job.

An original participant in the Hall's annual Stanley Cup Play-Off Hockey Draft since 1995 (and 2003 Champion with the Maple Leaf Construction Maple Leafs), Blake and





his family's company have been faithful corporate supporters of the Manitoba Sports Hall of Fame since the 1990s when former Chair Sam Fabro first drew him into the fold. His company has been a Platinum Host Sponsor at our Induction Dinner each and every year since the program was introduced in the 90s.

They say "if you want a job done well, go find the busiest people"... and that describes Blake Fitzpatrick to a tee: in addition to the aforementioned Hall of Fame volunteer work and his lifelong love affair with junior hockey, Blake is heavily involved with the Board of the True North Youth Foundation. Chair of the Sam

Fabro Classic Golf Tournament to raise funds for Fort Whyte Alive and he served on the Board of the Winnipeg Blue Bombers from 2000-2006.

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NEW BRUNSWICK SPORTS HALL OF FAME VOLUNTEER ANDREW MCLEOD



Andrew McLeod has been a dedicated volunteer with the NBSHF (New Brunswick Sports Hall of Fame) during most of the last decade. Andrew was the former Executive Director of Golf New Brunswick and has over 40 years of professional experience in association management. Andrew joined our Selection Committee in 2013 and immediately helped to usher in several system improvements to modernized our annual analysis and shortlisting of eligible Hall of Famer nominees.
